<mark>2007 FEES</mark>

A further reminder that all Nightcliff cricket senior fees paid **before 1 May 2007** attract a discount of 12.5%. Fees are **\$210 if paid before this date** and fees are **\$240** if paid after this date. Prompt payment of fees by the players is crucial to maintain and develop the Nightcliff Cricket Club and its facilities. Paying early is about equivalent to a free slab of beer. The **EFTPOS** facilities are **now available** at training to pay fees, including by credit (\$2 fee for credit transactions), so there are no excuses not to pay your dues. Part-Payments arrangements may be able to be made, but it is up to you to approach the Club, via the Treasurer Wayne Partridge or any Committee member to make arrangements.

RECIPE FOR THE TIGER ON THE GO – "CHIPS AND GRAVY"

- **Ingredients** \$4.00 chips from your local fish & chips shop & gravy see below.
 - **Method** Send your kid sister or brother down to the shops for the chips. Get them to grab a few beers whilst they're out. You can then whip up the gravy at home.

Gravy is best made starting with the juices and leftover bits of a cooked roast or meat as your base. If you have fat stored in the freezer (as any true gravy connoisseur should), start off melting some of that in your pan/tray. If none, melt a few tablespoons of butter in a metal tray or pan on the hotplate and get cracking with the following pre-prepared stuff:

- Sprinkle sifted plain flour onto the butter and some beef stock (and bacon and/or a tiny bit of vegetable stock if you have it) and "cook" it in the pan on a medium temperature, immediately mixing it into a paste with a wooden spoon, so there is no liquid left. Have some leftover flour mixed in with a bit of water on the side, so it is an easily useable liquid for later.
- Add some water to the paste and stir it (use a whisk or like weapon if stainless steel pan, or use a Carlton-edition wooden spoon). Add a tablespoon of Worcestershire or soy sauce (use some of both if you like) & some pepper and stir in whilst on the heat.



- This will thicken as it heats and you can adjust the texture to suit by adding some of your "flour paste" or just water, depending on what you are looking for. Other things you can whack in as variants include a pinch of lemon pepper, chicken salt or lemon juice. Go easy on the amount of stock and spice you put in though, sometimes less is best. You can also add a tiny bit of beer for that old-fashioned Aussie touch. If you want to get really funky with it, sear + add some diced onion and/or mushies on the Barbie.
- Make more than you need as there is quite a rigorous tasting process!
