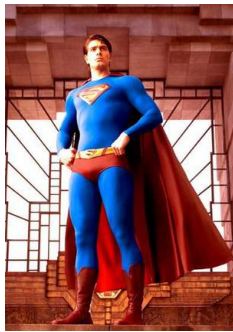

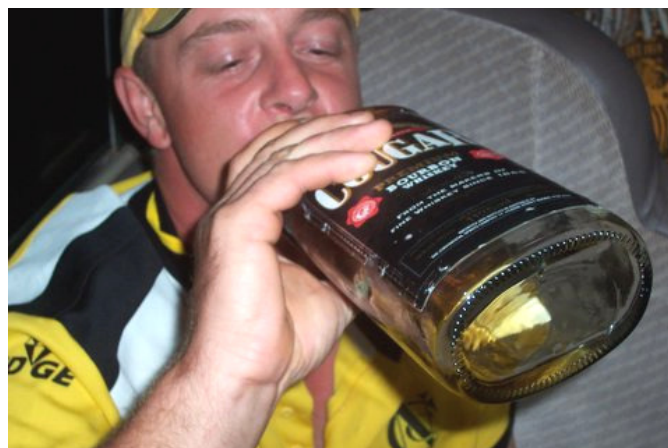

**RECIPE FOR THE TIGER ON THE GO – “HOME MADE KFC”**

1 1/2 teaspoon salt  
Pieces of dead chicken (removed skin for less fat content)  
two eggs, beaten like Richmond

Preheat oven to 220C degrees. Mix the above ingredients (not the chicken or egg).

Line the cooking tray with aluminum foil. Dip chicken pieces in the beaten egg, coat with the flour mixture. Place on cooking tray. Do not overlap pieces. Press butter on each piece of chicken. Sprinkle with flour mixture on top of chicken pieces. Pat down. Bake for 1 hour. Every 15 minutes add 1 teaspoon water and 1 teaspoon oil on each piece.

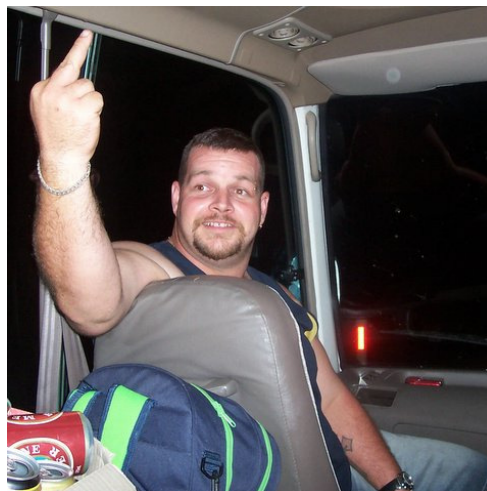
Turn oven up to 250C for last 10 minutes to make crispy.

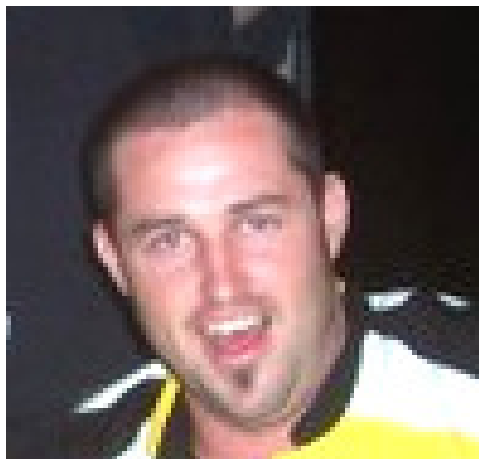
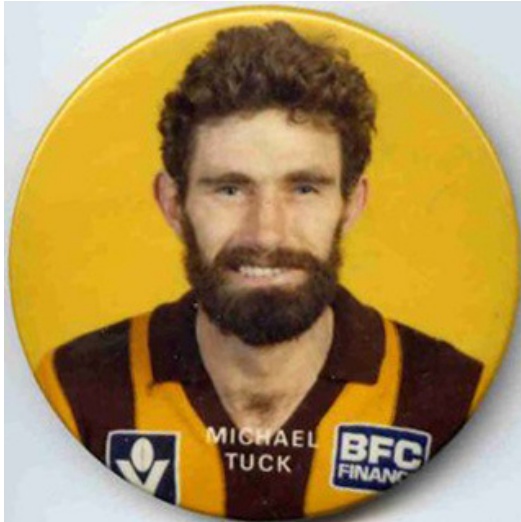
