# SECONDS WITH MARK HATTON...

Hey there my good man, so how many wickets have you taken for Nightcliff? I have a reasonable idea. Maybe five off (the 400<sup>th</sup>) mate? Yeah.

Ha ha, its 397 buddy, we were just messin' with ya! So tell us about your first ever cricket **played with Nightcliff?** 1st game was in 1983 playing at the Essington School grounds in U12's. Didn't bat and bowled 2 overs. Fielded fine leg and mid on/off and took 2 catches. My brother Jason was captain. I remember **Phillip Karlhuber** fielding at mid on/off with me and we mirrored each others movements to keep ourselves entertained, I was 9. Played my 1st senior match in 1985 I think. Gets a bit hazy these days. My brothers and I used to always go down and watch the D grade. Jason got a game here and there when really young and I followed seeking opportunities. Got a few games when the team was short and I would have been 11 at the time.

My first senior season was in 1987 aged 13yrs whilst still in juniors and I played half the season in the C's under the captaincy of **Bobby Mitchell**. Managed to win the bowling trophy for that year. Played the rest of the season in the B's when I learnt a lot about when to bowl different deliveries from a navy officer who left after that season and got I game in the A's. The team declared before I got to bat and I bowled only a couple of overs.

The Nightcliff A-Grade Flag in 1996 is an obvious (Darwin) highlight for you....any other stand outs? Quite a while ago now but I thought we had a real sniff at the flag and so I video taped the lead up, match and after party. The great thing about that win was the whole team had spent considerable time together and got along with each other very well (except Jason, Brad and  $m{I}$  had some tendency to argue between us!). We batted first and were slow going to start but just the one down at lunch. We still had wickets in the shed as the Saunderson brothers committed themselves in a difficult period of **Moody** and **Connors** bowling in tandem. I went in just after tea and batted with **Scott Saunderson** for a decent partnership then wickets fell and we managed 222 for the 80 overs. Jason and I both top scored with 48 runs each. We bowled well with decent pressure and had the game in the bag by tea time day 2. I remember Greg Connors at the non strikers end saying 'enjoy this' when they were 9 down. I managed 4 wkts and Brad got 3. Matt *Miller* picked up the final wicket.

One other game that stands out the most to me was the Major semi final against TV Dinners also in 1996. We hadn't beaten TV in many many years and they had fought back to needing 2 runs with 1 wkt in hand. I was bowling to **Richard Laidler** who was on 30 odd and first ball of the over he nicked it, the ball deflected off Scott Saunderson's gloves and lobbed to Greg Aldam at first slip. Our B's were sitting on the hill behind play at MCG #1 watching and they all went up with the catch, it was a great feeling and it was then that I felt we would win the GF that year.

Backyard cricket - who won that usually? How did the Krepapas fare on that particular battlefield? Naturally we played a massive amount of cricket in our backyard and given Jason is 2.5yrs older than me and 4yrs older than Brad, he dominated with bat, ball... and the rules! Heaps of other lads would play at our house with Anthony Hazeldine being a difficult bowler but couldn't keep the ball down, actually busted our bathroom piping one day smashing a lofted cover drive. Anthony Snell had real passion but I didn't get him so well, he kept calling himself Timmy Watson when everyone else was Lillee, Border, Thompson etc? Alex was a regular player often on Jason's team with Brad and I playing together. Felt I always had the wood on Krepap however!

Looking ahead towards your 400<sup>th</sup> victim, who would you enjoy taking your 400<sup>th</sup> against? Would you enjoy taking your 400th against the same team as Brad? Who was Brad's 400th wicket? I had to phone a friend for this answer! But I believe it was Page who Brad bowled early in the game (2nd wkt). Brad was on fire that day and that night also! I've always found TV **Dinners** the team I love to beat the most, mainly due to the beatings suffered throughout the 90's. If it happens against Tahs then so be it. Brad perhaps had more of a fairytale occasion with milestones and particularly because he was the first to achieve it. It's a coincidence though.

Which batsman/batsmen do you reckon you've dismissed the most? Who have you enjoyed bowling against? Who have you found the most challenging? Difficult to recall all players I've played against and I'll stick to Darwin cricket here, **Damien Kulmar** sticks out as a bit of a bunny of mine. Seemed to get him out early quite a bit. I always enjoyed bowling to players who take you on and a couple of players proved challenging to bowl to. Shaun Williams from Darwin used his feet well and possibly the best (left handed) player of spin. Martin Brown from PINT uses his feet well and is quick going down the track and also playing back. Most recently **Todd McCann** seems to play spin the best I have seen so far, won't use his feet but still has a decent game plan.

Geez, we haven't even got to ask you about playing Shield for Tassie or for the Canberra Comets...so one more question...when are you gonna start playing D-Grade man? Hmm, keep a seat warm on that bus trip to Jabiru in a few years time, but I've still got some unfinished business in A-Grade first!

This week we will be starting off our culinary journey in 2010 with a fantastic recipe from Nightcliff's very own 'Sultan of Spice', Manish Bhatnagar, who is as keenly passionate about his cooking as he is about...well pretty much everything else he does!

#### TOP-5 REASONS WHY COOKING AT HOME IS THE WAY TO GO!

- 1. Cooking at home is a fantastic ability to express yourself – it's like finger painting with food, you are the artist and the dinner plate is your blank canvass.
- 2. It makes great economic sense – and any leftovers can be properly stored away, including frozen in portions so you can relive that majestic culinary masterpiece once again.
- 3. Cooking is quite therapeutic and relaxing – from the aromas of those natural ingredients wafting through your house to the sensual pleasure of creating a meal, whether it is a gourmet five-course meal or a BBO spread that you have nailed, it will give you a tremendously fulfilling sense of pleasure and pride.
- 4. If you cop food poisoning, there's not too far to go before you can lie down in the sanctuary of your own bed. Or toilet floor.
- 5. If you get lucky on a dinner-date....well hey, see 4/ above. Except for maybe the toilet part...well, up to you really, we're not here to tell you how to live your life.

#### ORANGE CHICKEN

By Manish Bhatnagar

*Ingredients* + *Method* 

**500** gms chicken legs (love legs!) for two and a half people. Remove the skin from the legs.

Marinate Chicken with Lime and Garlic. Love the smell. Then further marinate chicken with half a cup of beaten natural yogurt beautifully white.

2 tea spoons of cumin. 2 spoons of coriander powder (same color as me after a few drinks). a pinch of saffron my favorite color,

**2 spoon of turmeric** good for the skin and a natural antibiotic.

2 spoons of chilli or 1 depends upon how hot you think your other half is ..

Leave overnight preferably (or even 1/2 hour) – if you have time, the longer the better.













#### **MANISH'S ORANGE CHICKEN** (CONTINUED)

Go to Coles Supermarket and buy a can of Pataks Butter chicken or Pataks moglai Chicken or **Chicken in coriander** While you are there pick yourself up a Taylor's red. Then get the wine glass and have a few when you get home.

Cut two onions very fine and start to fry them in olive oil, after 3 minutes add 1 stick of cinnamon, 2 bay leaves two cloves and 2 cloves with a few black peppers, keep frying the onion until they get to my colour (brown), approx 15 minutes on medium to high heat. (*Tip:* Already have all your other ingredients ready before you start frying)

Your eyes maybe crying after cutting those onions, so I recommend you top your glass up with red. (*Tip:* Wash your peeled onions under the cold tap before dicing)

Then add two fine cut tomatoes to the onions, fry till soft (as my heart) for about 5-7 minutes add a quarter of a cup of water. Add cubed potato pieces at this stage if you want.

**Add marinated chicken**, fry till slightly gold outside approx 14 minute smell the lovely aroma. Then **add the Pataks can**, the magic has started.

OK chicken cooks in 10 minute about 2 minutes before 10 minutes put the Indian magic spell called the garam masala, 2 spoons.

Add 4 spoons of sour cream or thick cream whatever turns you on, *I like thick cream*, marinate/garnish with coriander leaves.

#### **ADDITIONAL TIPS**

Get yourself some **basmati rice** wash 2 cups of rice, 'basmati' means *nice smell* put in a microwave dish add 4 and a half cups of water ,cook in the microwave for 14 minutes. Put some peas in the rice when cooking one clove and cardoman.

Footnote:

Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwllllantysiliogogogoch (lan-vire-pool-guin-githger-u-queern-drob-ooth-clandus-ilio-gogo-goch) is a Welsh word which translates roughly as "St Mary's Church in the Hollow of the White Hazel near a Rapid Whirlpool and the Church of St. Tysilio near the Red Cave".

Locals refer to the village as Llanfair, or as Llanfair PG (pronounced roughly "Hlan-var Pee Gee") to distinguish it from other places in Wales called "Llanfair(something)". Although typed as 58 characters, it is technically only 50 letters, because in Welsh *ll ng* and ch are treated as single letters.
